FOOD FOR THE SOUL

"As the time approached for him to be taken up to heaven, Jesus resolutely set out for Jerusalem." (Luke 9:51)

WOW! Lent is upon us. We have just completed a period called Ordinary Time. Ordinary Time is the period from Epiphany, January 6th, to the beginning of Lent. With the coming of Lent brings Shrove Tuesday and the making of some lovely, thick and fluffy pancakes—not those thin crepe type pancakes. But the stores are already filled with chocolate Easter eggs and hot crossed buns taking away that special reward you used to get for making it through those forty days of Lent.





UNIFORMS

When an ancient minister of the Methodist Church felt that it was respectful to a much-valued church member to say more than thanks at a remembrance service, he 'put on his uniform'. That meant putting on a shirt with a white 'dog collar'.

For sixty years it has been like a reminder that I have been challenged to be under a discipline which many do not understand, but that is a discussion for another time. It was when Joyce used the word uniform that I thought how much it is treated so differently over the years. My thoughts good and bad very much belong to a museum: a khaki felt hat worn by soldiers in the Boër war, a whistle on a lanyard, long socks with garters with strange green bits, round my neck a neckerchief with a woggle.

To make it smart, the item which first came to my mind, a sheath knife big enough to skin a deer, but used for sharpening pencils and trimming twigs on which we cooked rolled dough and called twists. I thought of that before I recall that I wore shorts, whatever the weather.

I suppose that I thought that policemen, nurses and sailors were among bright people who became recognised by their clothing. It was not a matter of salary, or privilege, although I think an Airforce One cadet would have been allowed free into Wimbledon before me.

What is important is what we value, the ability to take nostalgia and use it for the better understanding of others, and what they think they ought to wear and do.
